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# US President Trump Relied ON Israel's Begin Doctrine TO CANCEL The Nuclear Deal And Iran's Options Are limited: Either Abandon Its Ballistic Missile Program And Stop Supporting The Armed Factions IN Iraq, Syria, Yemen And Lebanon? Or The Starvation OF Its People?

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# Abstract

The hints of the presidential team close to US President Donald Trump undoubtedly confirm that Trump is determined to make a fateful decision on May 8 to reform or cancel the Iranian nuclear deal

In his historic speech today, Trump will say a very important phrase summarizing the US strategy and the axis of the tripartite Israeli-British-French alliance in the next stage, both in the Syrian and Lebanese scenes, or in the possible confrontation with Iran under the escalating Israeli-Iranian tension on the Syrian scene

Mr. Trump said it in one word: The number one priority for me is the cancellation of the disastrous agreement with Iran

It is the worst document ever seen

Frankly, this deal is an embarrassment to the United States

I have studied this subject in all its details. Believe me, it is a good agreement but rather an agreement?

In conjunction with a meeting of a number of American and European diplomats on the sidelines of the "Munich Security Conference" which took place from 16 to 18 February 2018

To try to find ways to curb Iran's destabilizing activities, some tried to persuade the US administration to extend the waiver of US sanctions, which expires on May 12, but rejected the offer because it was free of any guarantees.

If key countries such as France, Britain and Germany are looking for a way to start negotiations properly, one of the strong options is to impose new EU sanctions on Iranian missile development companies linked by the UN arms trafficking commission to Yemen?

And on 13 February, 2018

French President Emmanuel Macaron said that the spread of Iranian missiles inside Syria and Yemen is a threat to allies in the region, especially Saudi Arabia

MCCRON called for Iran to be "monitored for its ballistic missiles" and proposed new sanctions on Iran's ballistic missile program.

Such action at the broader European Union level would send a strong message that Europe sees Iranian missile proliferation as a threat and is ready to work with the United States to address it

What would mean the removal of US President Donald Trump from Iran's nuclear deal on May 8, 2018?

What are its implications?

President Trump announced on May 8, 2018

The United States will withdraw from the Iranian nuclear agreement and in the next few minutes I will sign a presidential memorandum to start imposing US sanctions against the Iranian regime. We will make sure that these economic sanctions are the highest in terms of rigor and any country that will help Iran in its nuclear program will also be subject to sanctions.

America will not be exposed or hostage to Iran's nuclear blackmail?

But the central question here is the implications of the cancellation of the Iranian nuclear agreement.

US President Trump imposed the toughest economic sanctions on the Iranian regime, but not direct sanctions?

Why?

First: because it is secondary sanctions by targeting international banks dealing with the Iranian oil sector?

Companies and banks will have three to six months to end trade ties with Iran

Will it end up imposing sanctions on America's allies if they deal with them in the future?

Second: The Iranian agreement was obtained to restrict Iran's nuclear activity through several items, the most important of which are:

Reducing Iran's uranium stockpile

Stop the operation of the Arak facility used to make plutonium that can be used to make nuclear weapons

To allow extensive inspections by the IAEA to verify that Iran is adhering to the items

But what does the US withdrawal mean in practice, not by default?

Iran's nuclear deal will remain in force and why is America one of several parties to that agreement?

Therefore Iranian President ROHANI said:

That his country will abide by the terms of the agreement if other countries such as France, Germany ... ETC signed the agreement to abide by it?

ROWHANI also said:

Iran is ready to enrich uranium if the Europeans cannot convince Iran that staying in the deal is worth it?

However, US President Trump cancels Iran's nuclear deal and its European partner states are all still committed to it. Trump's sanctions have seemed inaccurate and without strategy and target European companies and banks that are supposed to be allies of Washington.

Since the easing of international sanctions against Iran, European companies have been quick to enter the Iranian market, most notably:

German car company Daimler sells about 40,000 cars a year to Iran

Italian oil and gas company SAIPEM has signed an agreement with Iran worth five billion US dollars

European Airbus, which promised to supply Iran with 100 passenger planes

It remains to be seen whether the cancellation of the nuclear agreement will help accelerate Iran's economic collapse. Will this collapse contribute to keeping the United States from going to war against Iran? No one can define the borders and lines and parties to participate in them or know their international and regional repercussions in the Middle East, which is already under security.

1. Introduction The premise of our research starts from the following:

1.1. The Hypothesis OF Research:

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There is an almost absolute agreement between Trump's administration and Israel's top security political leadership that both are determined to continue the same approach of using economic tools to pressure Iran to choose between either reforming the nuclear agreement or canceling it in exchange for allowing billions of revolutions in foreign banks and the economy Iran's current situation is in desperate need with the appreciation of the dollar and the devaluation of the Iranian riyal to frightening levels of 600 thousand Iranian riyals compared to one hundred dollars?

The Israeli and US plans also agree on another fundamental point of not allowing the Iranians to build an operational infrastructure in Syria. The high technological capabilities of air defense systems, along with medium and long range missiles, are a red line for Israel, even at the expense of direct confrontation.

According to military experts and experts, if there is a military clash between Israel and Iran after the T-4, it will be limited in scope and includes the Syrian arena, and will intimidate the land front in the Golan and the Upper Galilee?

And will not slip into a full-scale war between the Iranians and the Israelis. Hezbollah will not join this battle, which currently does not serve its interests in Lebanon because it is busy in the parliamentary elections because of its political importance because it is in dire need of a political incubator that protects and strengthens its popular status. Between his supporters on the one hand and the party's unwillingness economically and politically

Any future military confrontation with the IDF?

1.1.2 Problematic search:

The problem arises from the following:

First: International diplomatic efforts on Iran's nuclear program are focused on Tehran's compliance with the agreements established to ensure that peaceful nuclear work is not a cover for the development of a nuclear weapon.

The challenge of knowing what is going on in Iran is very difficult not only because of the obstacles posed by Tehran but also because the same techniques - especially uranium enrichment and reprocessing spent nuclear fuel - can be used for both civilian and military purposes.

Second: Iran's success in its pursuit of uranium enrichment and reprocessing technologies in the late 1980s, obtaining centrifuge systems from Pakistan - through the nuclear black market - and a laser enrichment plant obtained from China. A decade later, more advanced than Russia Since February 2010, Iran has produced 20 per

cent enriched uranium hexafluoride at the NATANZ pilot fuel enrichment plant in October 2009. Instead, Iranians have also begun to produce 20 per cent enriched material In the Fordo facility - and by U U / June 2012 - produced about 140 kg of uranium hexafluoride at the facility in NATANZ- where some of them have been transferred to Isfahan for the purpose of manufacture of fuel

But it has tested many of the more advanced models, although the progress has been modest so far, and it is not clear whether this is due to design and manufacturing problems or lack of access to raw materials such as carbon fiber and marten site steel as a result of sanctions or restricting access of the International Atomic Energy Agency Iranian sites.

Iran is building a heavy water reactor designed for the production of plutonium in ARRAK and could eventually be used to manufacture a nuclear weapon?

Thirdly, the Israeli and US administrations have taken into consideration the Russian-Iranian strategic partnership in the Middle East, specifically the Russian-Iranian coordination in the Syrian arena. The Israelis believe that

Russia was, is and will remain?

As an influential figure within the "five plus one" group that negotiated a nuclear deal with Iran, especially in the context of the West's withdrawal from the Middle East.

The strategy of Russian President Putin was behind the realization of his personal interest in the talks: On the Iranian nuclear program is determined by two goals:

First, an agreement with Iran would open more opportunities for cooperation. On the one hand, Russia may prefer not to have nuclear weapons; it was easy to persuade them to participate in the talks to curb Tehran's nuclear program.

Second, Moscow felt that the program was less threatening to it than the West, and finally put its desire to confront the West above all else. From the point of view of the United States and the European Union, this may not be logical, but Moscow often ignores the real risks and exaggerates that illusion - which explains its obsession with the potential threat to NATO.

Therefore, it will deal with caution and anticipation with the repercussions of the US president's decision to cancel or reform the Iranian nuclear agreement, which is scheduled for May 12.

Fourth, how can US President Donald Trump balance the US-Russia relationship in the Syrian arena with Trump's tough strategy toward Iran and its controversial nuclear program as Iran continues to develop its provocative ballistic missile program against Israel?

For President Trump, he has expressed two contradictory policies during his presidential campaign: Iran, its nuclear program, its ballistic missile capabilities, and the Iranian central bank's continued transfer of funds to armed groups in Yemen, Syria and southern Lebanon?

And the US desire to improve relations with Russia. ?

These goals are not in line with Putin's desire to partner with Trump in Syria, but Syria is where Putin is closely allied with Iran. Hezbollah and the regime of Bashar Assad?

In order to differentiate between Iran and Russia, Trump must resolve this contradiction?

Is President Trump able to resolve this contradiction in the foreseeable future or not? Sixth: Iran's nuclear program, Russian-Israeli relations, and the question of the continuation of Russian support for Iran, Lebanese Hezbollah and Bashar Assad's regime in Syria?

The dilemma also raises the question of whether President Putin can continue to balance Israel's interests with his growing relationship with Iran. The Lebanese Hezbollah and the Bashar al-Assad regime after President Trump took a decision to scrap or reform the Iranian nuclear deal on May 12?

Field indicators are not hypothetical and confirm that it is unclear how long Putin can maintain this policy.

There is no doubt that Putin did not hesitate to overlook Israel's interests when it comes to selling the S-300 missiles to Iran. Or to Syria?

In fact, it is not in Israel's interest that Putin continue to support Assad and thereby expand Iran's influence in the Middle East. Trump can encourage and support US allies, such as Israel, to make it more difficult for Putin to maintain a balance of good relations with all parties. And must increase security cooperation with its allies to demonstrate its continued commitment to the Middle East?

Seventh, based on the Begin Doctrine, President Trump will have to comply with this doctrine for the most important reasons, the most serious of which is Iran's continued development of ballistic missile capabilities that threaten Israel's national security on the one hand and the absence of realistic EU guarantees that Trump makes sure that the Iranian Central Bank will not employ billions of dollars to support The armed groups in Yemen, Syria and Lebanon on the one hand or invest in developing their ballistic missile capabilities or nuclear capabilities on the other hand?

A challenge to the "Begin Doctrine" is the most difficult test for the administration of President Donald Trump and the implications of his historic decision on May 12?

Under this doctrine can destroy any nuclear reactor in the region, including the Iranian nuclear reactors?

The destruction of the reactor is therefore the Begin Doctrine, which does not allow the development of any threatened nuclear capabilities in the Middle East.

Syria's experience is present, when the military and political leadership decided to bomb the Syrian reactor. There was a broad consensus among the Israeli military and political leadership that there was no other choice but to destroy the reactor in a military operation, even if this might lead to a possible escalation.

Eighth: Under BEGIN's doctrine, President Trump will take into account his historic decision on May 12 as follows:

First, Israel will not allow any diplomatic option, but wants Trump to be a serious strategic choice

Second, Israel will pressure the Trump administration to reject the proposal of US President Trump or the European Union to issue a final ultimatum to Iran for its ballistic missile program,

And that Iran should allow international inspectors to visit the reactor or its research centers or sites to manufacture this system of missiles because Israel is confident that Iran will reject this option on the one hand

And that the option of "diplomacy first" might provide Iran with room to take immediate steps to conceal and protect long-range and medium-range missiles, making them impossible to destroy. And the possibility of transportation and distribution inside or outside Iranian territory is possible logistically?

Israeli decision-makers, led by Israeli President Benjamin Netanyahu,

That Israel should not place crucial elements of its national security in the hands of outside parties, including US President Donald Trump, even though the United States is a very friendly strategist. This is still a valid principle today.

President Donald Trump To know that the principle of Begin is not negotiable in the foreseeable future or the medium and that Israel will not allow Iran and others to approach and not enter the nuclear club and must remain Israel leading and leader of nuclear weapons in the Middle East and to have alone the monopoly of the right Nuclear weapons as a strategic deterrent weapon against Iran, the Lebanese Party or any other country in the Middle East?

Ninth: Israel sees Iran's nuclear program as a more serious challenge to the "Begin Doctrine" than the two programs that were destroyed in Iraq and Syria. The Iranian project does not revolve around a single reactor, but rather combines the uranium and plutonium pathways within a broad framework of manpower, knowledge, facilities and infrastructure in a more remote country that places a wide range of agents and skills in the Middle East - some close to Israel - And has the ability to respond and inflict great harm on Israel by carrying out its operations directly or through its agents, such as the Lebanese Hezbollah?

Tenth: The Israeli political and military systems realized the following absolute:

Israel knows through its reports and intelligence efforts that Iran will not give up its program and dream of nuclear weapons in the near or medium range, and that it needs time?

Iran is aware that Israel, the United States and the European Union are closely following its nuclear program and acting accordingly. Moreover, Iran's nuclear program has a broad and deep international context, and any action against it will inevitably affect and be influenced by this context.

The nuclear agreement between Iran and the leading nations of the international community from the point of view of the US administration after Trump and the Israeli administration led by Netanyahu led to the acquisition of Iran for a precious time, but they (Israel and the United States of America)

Did not rule out Iran's nuclear ambitions, did not deprive Iran of its nuclear infrastructure and would eventually allow it to become a state on the verge of acquiring nuclear weapons. This is contrary to BEGIN's Israeli doctrine and the US administration must take these Israeli concerns seriously in any decision taken on May 12, whether to reform or cancel the Iranian nuclear agreement?

**1.1.3** What are the geopolitical and strategic dimensions of Israel's dependence on BEGIN's approach to stopping nuclear threats in the Middle East? Can it be used by President Trump's recent decision to cancel or reform Iran's nuclear program, scheduled for May 12, 2018?

Israel's dependence on BEGIN's approach to stopping nuclear threats in the Middle East?

Israel's action in Syria was not unprecedented, but rather mirrored the June 1981 air strike against the OSIRAK nuclear facility outside Baghdad, Iraq. Following the destruction of the Iraqi facility,

Menachem Begin, then prime minister, stated that if Iraq could have developed nuclear weapons, "another Holocaust would have happened," but instead the country decided to "defend our people with all the means at our disposal" and "not allow any enemy to develop weapons of mass destruction turned against us." Israel's strategy of preemptively striking the nuclear facilities of its regional enemies subsequently became known as the "Begin Doctrine."?

The Middle East, specifically the Arab Gulf states, Turkey and the international coalition forces in Syria are condemning Israel for employing BEGIN's term in stopping the nuclear program in the Middle East when Israel made its decision to destroy Syria's nuclear reactor.

Israeli military experts and analysts confirm that Begin has served twice in the Middle East. Agencies:

First, despite the destruction of the Iraqi nuclear reactor at the beginning of the eighties by Israel, the danger of chemical and biological weapons remained. These weapons were used against the Iraqi people, specifically the Kurdish HallabJA

. But the important question is what if we assume that Israel did not bomb the Iraqi reactor, what would happen to the weapons?

If it fell into the hands of terrorist groups after the fall of Saddam Hussein's regime in 2003?

Were the terrorists, especially al-Zarqawi's al-Qaeda, using them against the Iraqi people and certain areas?

By destroying the Iraqi nuclear reactor, chemical weapons were already used against both the Kurds and the Iranians, making it possible for the rest of the world to liberate Kuwait after a few years without worrying about a nuclear strike by the former regime in Iraq before 2003

Second, by destroying the Syrian reactor that was built in North Korea, they prevented potential scenarios in which advocacy, advocacy or other armed terrorist groups would obtain nuclear weapons or radioactive materials.

This could have led to an unimaginable disaster. The Deir al-Zour area, which includes the reactor, has witnessed extensive fighting over the past few years, with effective control over its main city and the remaining two-year pipeline to the region

Will the world be thankful to Israel after its destruction of the Iranian influence for the third time?

The world owes Israel and its use of BEGIN's principle of stopping nuclear weapons in the Middle East. The world condemns Israel more than the Israeli military experts and analysts say

Israel, according to intelligence reports, has completed all political and economic preparations to strike Iran, but Israel

Was delayed to carry out the strike not because of the completion of military preparedness or fear of regional and international reactions. Rather, the delay decision concerned Israel's study of the consequences of the destruction of an active reactor because there are differences between the Iraqi reactor and the Syrian reactor.

#### Active Nuclear Facilities

Attaching an active or "hot" nuclear reactor carries significant risks, because damage to the nuclear core or space fuel pools may cause significant radioactive harm to both the environment and surrounding population. When Israel attacked the Syrian and Iraqi nuclear reactors it knew there was no risk of radioactive damage, because the reactors were not yet active. This is no longer guaranteed, as countries are now at advanced stages of the nuclear development process. Moving forward, Israel will face a dilemma when deciding whether to strike a nuclear facility, which, if active, could create significant radioactivity concerns

**1.1.4** Israel's reaction to the decision of US President TRANB on the cancellation of the Iranian nuclear agreement?

Therefore, we value greatly and I am very much appreciated and the entire Israeli people should greatly appreciate President Trump's determination to stop this bad agreement and stop the Iranian aggression

. Stop this bad agreement and prevent Iran from producing an arsenal of nuclear bombs

The price of war today is cheaper than the price of war in a year, two or five years.

The introduction of advanced Iranian anti-aircraft batteries into Syria is a declaration of war, and every aircraft to be transported in Ramat David, HATZOR, NEVEAT or Ben-Gurion Airport will be at the mercy of air defense, which Israel cannot afford.

Lieberman made this point to the Russians: If Russia decides to deploy anti-aircraft systems of the S-300 in Syria, Israel may destroy it

In other words, Israel is prepared to accept the presence of an Iranian police force in Syria, but it will destroy any advanced Iranian regime capable of threatening Israel, including ballistic missiles.

This links us to the other front, in which Israel and Iran collide - the nuclear front, represented by Begin, and no one should go beyond it.

What Netanyahu and Lieberman hope to achieve?

The Iranian regime is dealing with an escalating economic and moral crisis.

The Iranian currency, of course, collapsed.

The Iranian nuclear deal did not give the Iranians the economic return they hoped to get, because the remaining sanctions and Trump's comments have hampered banks and international companies from returning and cooperating with Iran.

Military spending in Syria and Yemen - about \$ 2 billion annually - has exacerbated the deficit.

Israel hopes that the additional economic blow that will follow the American withdrawal will lead to the Iranian nuclear agreement, which is actually happening? To the collapse of the Iranian economic system, which is achieved during the coming period, which may not exceed one or two years?

Changing regime in Iran is Netanyahu's hope?

This will be the greatest achievement for his government by removing a regional force that is threatening Israel, which is Iran? On the other hand, the Lebanese Hezbollah, after winning the legislative elections, will find a difference between withdrawing from the south and replacing the Lebanese army.
